Independence Day 2005 came a couple days early for former WKCC President Tom Logan. On Friday, July 1st Tom commenced working at the Kensington Repair Shop that he founded in 1997 as the General Manager and mentor to the new owner, Master Mechanic Rene Guzman.

The halls are filled with joyful sounds and the building is bursting with youthful energy as the new school year gets under way at Evergreen School in Wheaton, Maryland. Yet, as the school year starts, the entire school community is mindful of the hardships of so many affected by Hurricane Katrina. In the face of such overwhelming tragedy, feelings of compassion are mixed with helplessness. 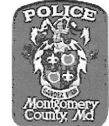

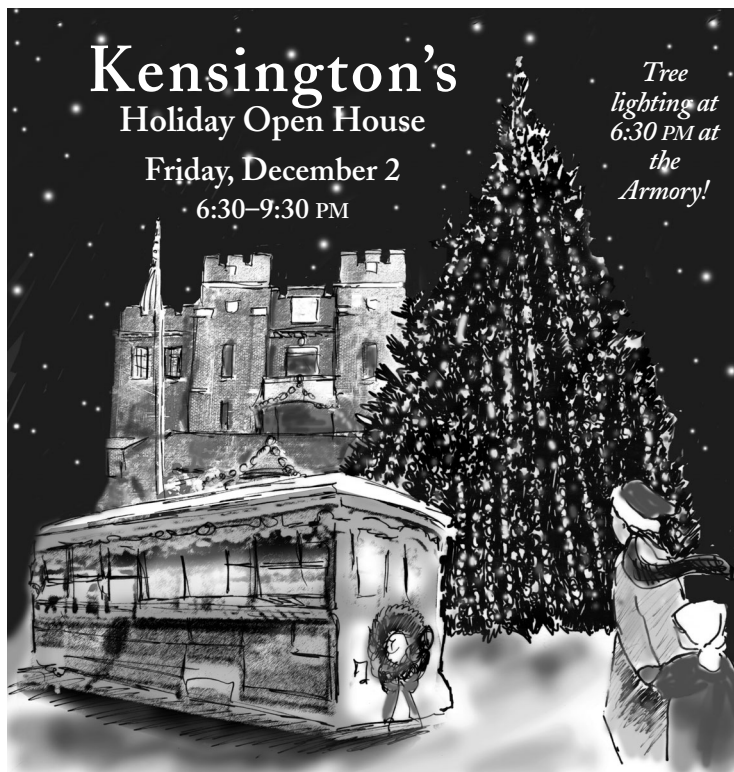
