FBCW Volunteers with New Orleans Recovery

It's been three years since Louisiana, Mississippi and the Gulf Coast of Alabama suffered the worst Natural Disaster in U.S. History. Aside from the thousands of lives that were lost by hurricanes Katrina and Rita, here are some statistics about just the damage done to New Orleans alone:

- Inundation of 80 percent of the city with 480 billion gallons of water that sat for nearly a month.

- Damage or complete destruction of 95 percent of the city's nearly 350 buildings, including the New Orleans Police Department Headquarters.

- Hundreds of miles of underground utilities - electric, gas, water, drainage, cable and phone lines - damaged.

- Residential damages of \$14 billion in Orleans Parish. Of the city's 188,251 occupied housing units, 134,344 sustained reportable damage, and 105,155 were severely damaged.



Wheaton Studio of Dance Celebrates 50th Anniversary

Wheaton Studio of Dance is celebrating its 50th year at 11216 Triangle Lane in Wheaton. Five years ago, Shannon Rush bought the studio from her mentor and the studio's founder, Joni Reese-Naber. Rush has since extended the legacy of the studio that has sent dozens of students on to professional careers, and provided thousands of area residents with fun and creative dance sessions.

When Reese-Naber sold the business to Rush, she kept dancing as part of the Palm Springs Follies, a performance group geared toward seniors that performs about 115 shows per year.

Shannon Rush, 31, has been involved with the studio since she began dancing there at age 3, and has worked hard to continue the spirit of the studio. Reese-Naber, 72, opened the studio in 1959 with a \$125 deposit for first month's rent and a few hundred dollars more to fix up the building.

Then the studio had only one performance space, and now has two. The cost for a dance lesson was \$1.50 and Reese-Naber had about 40 students. Now, the cost is about \$12 to \$15 per session and the studio has more than 600 students per year with more than 60 classes.

Warner Memorial Presbyterian Church to Hold 115-year Anniversary



The Warner Memorial Presbyterian Church in Kensington will celebrate its anniversary 9:30 a.m. Sept. 28 at the church, 10123 Connecticut Avenue in Kensington. Worship services for the church were originally held in a two-room schoolhouse in 1890.

The church stood on the site now occupied by the Kensington Armory. At the celebration, the Rev. David Graybill, Warner's pastor from 1978-1988, will share recollections about the church during his decade as pastor. He will also preach at the 11 a.m. service.

Following the service, there will be a pot luck luncheon in the social hall, featuring scrapbooks of historical pictures and a showing of "The Building of Warner," a film shot during the construction of the building from 1954 through 1956.

Preparing for Storms

- Assemble a storm emergency kit that contains a first aid kit, flashlights, fresh batteries, a battery-operated radio or television, emergency telephone numbers and other personal necessities.
- Have a corded landline telephone and/or a fully charged cellular phone available.
- Keep a three-day supply of bottled water and nonperishable food items on hand.

How to Control Rising Energy Costs In Hot Weather:

- During the day, keep shades and blinds closed to deflect sunlight and heat.
- Keep your air conditioner’s thermostat set between 75 and 78 degrees F. Each degree you raise the setting can lower your monthly electric bill by five percent.
- Have an HVAC professional check your air conditioner for coolant leaks and ensure proper functioning. Clean or replace air filters monthly.

- Make certain all windows and outside doors are closed while your AC is running.
- Be sure heat-producing appliances are away from your thermostat. These items can cause your AC unit to run longer than necessary.



- Keep furniture and objects from blocking vents, fans and ducts.
- On excessively hot days, raise your thermostat setting and then spend time in a mall, recreation center or other public indoor area.



- Safeguard your electronic equipment by using surge protectors.
- Be ready to evacuate special needs and elderly persons to alternate locations with power if necessary.
- Prepare a family emergency plan and review it periodically.
- Keep Pepco’s outage number – 1-877-PEPCO-62 – handy. If your phone number has changed recently, call Customer Care at 202-833-7500 to update the outage tracking system.

went out from First Baptist Church of Wheaton, a longstanding member of the Wheaton & Kensington Chamber of Commerce. Larry White, a Chamber Board member, was among them.



Once in New Orleans, the group was divided between youth and adults teams. The youth along with their sponsors took temporary residence at Dillard University. The adult team stayed in a hotel in the heart of the French Quarter.

The adults partnered with Habitat for Humanity and the New Orleans Mission - an outreach to the many thousands of homeless in the city. In addition to assisting at the Mission they also helped in the rebuilding of 3 houses that were severely damaged by Katrina in the 9th ward. Each participant paid their own way and although most were largely unskilled in construction, they were successful in putting up siding, roofing and installing fencing.

To do work on housing required a minimum age of 18 so the FBCW youth contributed to the recovery



by clearing debris still cluttering the landscape around local homes and parks.

Clark Robinson, the Missions Pastor at FBCW said, "This was a great experience for both the youth and adults! To be able to be hands-on in helping those who are less fortunate and are in such dire need was a moving experience for all of us and encourages us to try to do more both locally, nationally, and internationally."



On Sunday, November 2, 2008, Downtown Wheaton will play host to the "World of Montgomery Festival," an event dedicated to celebrating, exploring and sharing the diverse cultural heritages that play an active role in the lives of Montgomery County residents and communities. This free, outdoor event, organized by the Arts and Humanities Council of Montgomery County (AHCMC) and Latino Economic Development Corporation (LEDC) in partnership with Montgomery County Government, seeks to revive the widely popular Ethnic Heritage Festival that took place in Silver Spring during the late 1990's through the early 2000's. The World of Montgomery Festival will take place one block north of the Wheaton Metro Station from 12:00 noon to 4:00PM. Upwards of 5,000 attendees are expected for this event.

The cultural activities and entertainment presented at the Festival will be organized around the theme of remembering and celebrating ancestors. Cultural and ethnic groups throughout the world and across the County practice a wide variety of traditions related to this theme. Such a focus will offer a context for the activities being presented--music, dance, visual art, and storytelling, for example, and will educate Festival visitors about the important, contemporary role these activities play within the County's many ethnic and cultural communities. It also will give Festival visitors the opportunity to learn about and celebrate the historical figures and long established communities who have influenced the County's development as well as the diverse array of more recently established communities who are actively shaping its contemporary character.

In addition, a variety of food vendors, drawn from the Wheaton area and the wider County, will be present to offer visitors the opportunity to sample a portion of the culinary diversity for which the County is known. Local non-profit organizations and County agencies also will be represented.

The British Players, originally formed in 1964 as The British Embassy Players by keen Embassy staffers, was incorporated in the District of Columbia as a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization in March 2006.

Though no longer performing at the Embassy Rotunda the Group's educational and charitable mission continues: bringing British plays and shows to Washington area theatre lovers and giving to British and American charities (over \$400,000, to date).

With over 200 mainly British and American skilled and talented members drawn from Maryland, Virginia and Washington DC, The Players present a varied theatre season each year and support many educational and social activities.

The Players' major productions include comedies and dramas by British playwrights, British pantomimes, musical revues, and the annual Old Time Music Hall - the 45th of which will be presented in 2009 - in addition to special one-night fundraisers for local organisations.

The Players also sponsor, and provide the reviewers for, the annual Ruby Griffith Award Competition (named after an early mentor of the group and begun in 1969) for excellence in amateur theatre productions. It attracts about 30 entries on average from local community theatre groups. Each participating theatre group is provided a combined written critique of their entry.

The season culminates in a social event attended by representatives of the competing theatres and where the Players' Patroness, presently Lady Sheinwald, wife of the British Ambassador, presents the awards.


